About these frameworks

Back in the late 1990s, a group of scientists, policymakers, business leaders, and changemakers set out to define what sustainability really means and how to achieve it. They created a science-based framework that outlines the boundaries we must respect to ensure a livable future, along with a planning method that works across cultures, sectors, and scales.

Since then, this framework has been tested, refined, and applied around the world. It helped shape the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), inspired the circular economy, and informed the Planetary Boundaries framework. It has guided thousands of organizations and millions of people toward strategic, systemic change.



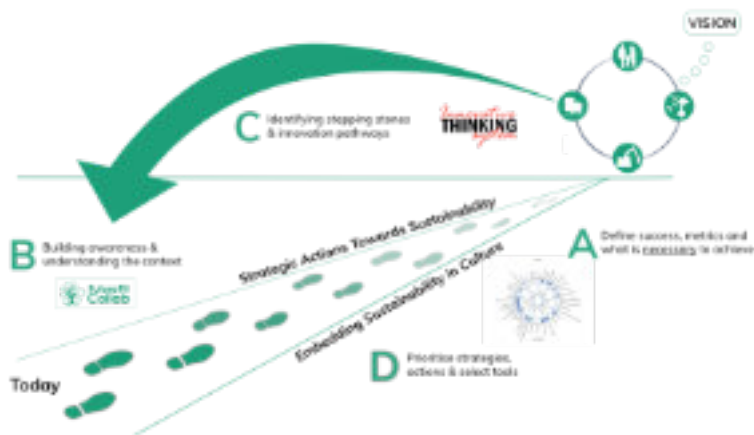
A powerful foundation

Today, this same framework offers a powerful foundation for shaping a Sustainable Philippines. It equips individuals, institutions, and communities with the tools and structure to meet urgent challenges head-on. This program builds on that legacy, offering multiple ways to engage, and it may well serve as a vital blueprint for the next decade of transformation.

Program

Pre-Course Work

Participants come to the certification course with varying levels of knowledge and experience. To ensure everyone starts with a common foundation, all participants are provided access to the FSSD Foundational eLearning. This course builds a solid understanding of the scientific basis of sustainable development and aligns everyone with the core concepts of the FSSD before the live sessions begin. As a result, we can dive straight into deeper content and application during the certification program. The first session includes a reflection on the eLearning, with space for questions and clarification. The eLearning is accessible on both smartphones and desktop or laptop devices for flexible learning.



Part 1: Systems Thinking & Visioning

Reaching full sustainability doesn’t happen overnight. It begins with a deep understanding of the system we’re working in. Knowing the context helps us define a shared vision of the future, and also reveals the leverage points, barriers, risks, and opportunities we may encounter along the way.

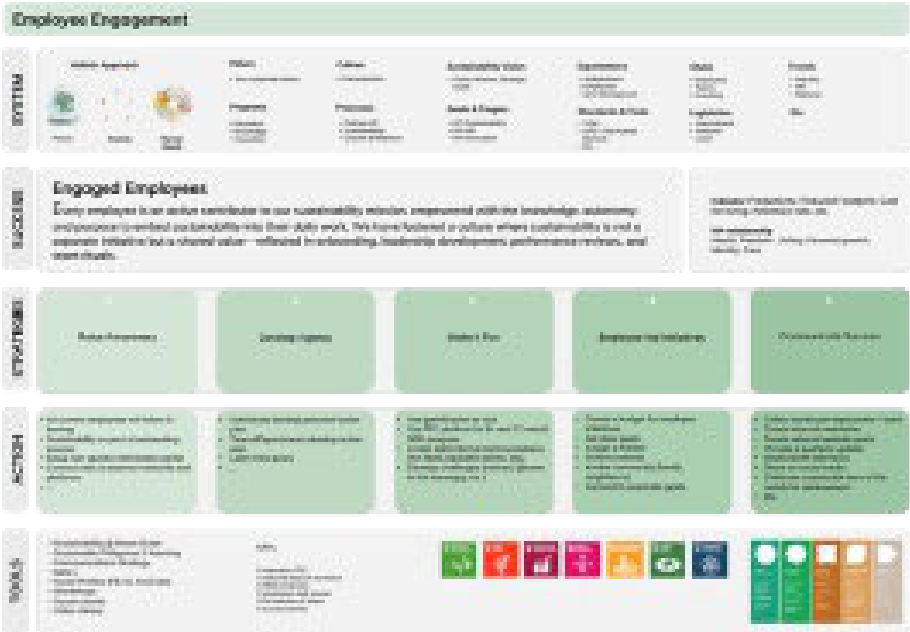
Once we understand how our system works, we can begin to shape the outcomes we want to achieve. A strong, compelling vision - supported by clear strategic goals - helps us stay focused, build momentum, and track our progress over time. When described well, a vision acts like a magnet. It attracts energy, people, and new ideas. It creates a sense of purpose, offering a hopeful and practical counter to the often negative stories surrounding sustainability.

Part 2: Strategic Planning

Now that we understand what sustainability requires, the next step is to assess where we are today. Establishing a clear baseline allows us to map out short-term, mid-term, and long-term solutions to guide our journey forward. Often, low-hanging fruits can be identified early, offering quick wins that build momentum and help communicate progress to stakeholders and partners.

For more complex challenges, we will use Innovative Thinking Systems (ITS™) to uncover hidden assumptions, generate synergetic solutions that address multiple issues at once, and guide decisions around investments, organizational changes, and key enablers for long-term impact.

But it is not just about ideas, it is about making smart, strategic choices. To support this, we apply three core strategic questions, combined with local regulations and focus areas, to help identify the most effective actions, tools, and strategies to include in our sustainability plans.



The Sustainability Roadmap

The Five Level Framework (5LF) provides a structured, visual overview of the outcomes from the backcasting process, also known as the ABCD method. For each strategic goal, it maps out key information, including relevant systems insights, a clear definition of success when no negative impact remains, indicators to measure progress, strategies to achieve the goal, specific actions to carry out those strategies, and the tools needed to support decision-making, monitoring, and learning.

When combined, these visual frameworks form a complete strategic plan for an organization, faculty, LGU, or barangay. It acts as both a roadmap and a compass, guiding actions over the next several years.



Post-Course work

During the certification program, each participant will complete at least one 5LF. After the program, participants will finalize a full version that includes their vision and strategic goals. They will receive feedback on their work, either individually or as a team, depending on whether they represent the same organization, department, or unit.
